



Rev. Clark Olsen

Selma Violence Survivor

Comes to Youngstown Sept 26-28

Rev Clark Olsen traveled to Selma in March 1965 at the request of Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. to join the march from Selma to Montgomery. On the night of March 9, Rev. Olsen, Rev. James Reeb and Rev. Orloff Miller were attacked by racists as they walked from dinner to a church meeting.

One of the attackers hit Rev. Reeb in the head with a club; he lost consciousness in Rev. Olsen's arms, and died two days later. In retelling his story, Rev. Olsen reflects on his place in the larger arc of justice that led to the passage of the Civil Rights acts and on our continuing work for racial justice.
